## VII. APPENDICES

Appendices are placed after the acknowledgments section and before the references. They must have a level-one heading (all caps, bold), which may be in a variety of styles. For a single appendix, use `\appendix*` followed by `\section{title}` to suppress the appendix letter in the section heading:

APPENDIX: SURVEY OF RESULTS

For multiple appendices, letter labels should be used. Generally speaking, the `\appendix` command signals that all following sections are appendices. Therefore, `\section{title}`, when placed after the `\appendix` command, will set title as an appendix heading (an empty `{title}` is permitted). Consider the following example:

```
\appendix
```

\section{CALCULATION OF THE CROSS SECTION}
```

```

This will display as

**APPENDIX A: CALCULATION OF THE  
CROSS SECTION**  
**APPENDIX B**

Subheadings within an appendix are numbered with arabic numbers in the style of level three.

Displayed equations in a first or sole appendix are numbered (A1), (A2), (A3), etc. Equations in a second appendix are numbered (B1), (B2), (B3), etc. Note that the letter and number are not separated by a space, dash, or period.
